VACANCIES FOR VOLUNTARY ASSISTANT TREE WARDEN

Arundel benefits enormously from the voluntary work done by the Town Council's specialist advisors. We are now seeking to appoint an assistant to work with our Tree Warden, Bob Tanner.

The Role

Arundel has many notable trees and there are plans to plant many more trees in the town in the coming years. The ecological and environmental value of a flourishing planting programme is evident. Residents fully appreciate the contribution that trees make to the attractiveness of Arundel, as was shown by the enthusiasm to sponsor the new Lime Trees in Mill Road last autumn. Further sponsorships and the establishment of an Arundel Tree Nursery are planned for the years ahead. All of these positive developments are the fruits of the Tree Warden's work.

The Assistant Tree Warden will work with Bob Tanner on all aspects of Arundel's tree programme. The terms of reference for the Tree Warden are as follows:

- To advise the Council's Planning Advisory Committee on all tree related planning applications in Arundel.
- To work with the Town Clerk and Councillors for the benefit of the whole community.
- To be the eyes and ears of Arundel; local people will often see what needs to be done before council officials or landowners – as Tree Warden you should be the focal point for such issues and act as the link on tree matters between the community and the council, as well as being a catalyst for getting tree projects started and supported.
- Submit quarterly Tree Warden reports to Full Council.

Any previous knowledge will be beneficial, but the principal requirement is a real interest in developing and protecting trees in Arundel. Training will be provided. The role is unpaid, but any reasonable expenses will be provided.
