We are local residents with experience in transport planning, cycling facilities, map making, local government working and community projects and keen to see safe, attractive cycling and walking facilities across the town for everyone.

As well as our own local knowledge, we have drawn on comments, concerns and ideas about walking, cycling and general access to key locations raised by Arundel people in consultations over the years. We report back to the town through the Town Council. A final report with summarised, anonymised comments will go to the Department for Transport and be publicly available.

Approved Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plans (LCWIPs) that follow government guidance, will take higher priority when considered for government funding through Active Travel England. This is already happening with schemes across the country.

The Arundel Local Cycling & Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP) will be unusual in being entirely produced by the community.

The LCWIP is a **high level network plan**. It will include options, design ideas and very rough costs to implement each of the network routes. Before approval and funds can be obtained for any scheme to be taken forward, designs will need to be drafted and to come back to the Arundel community for full consultation.
