

Arundel Tidal Walls Scheme – 16 October-3 November 2023

Arundel Tidal Walls Scheme (Phase 2) schedule for the weeks commencing 23 October and 30 October. Please expect a continued construction presence, including workers and deliveries of materials and equipment.

Arundel Tidal Walls Scheme Construction Work

We have now completed approximately two-thirds of the total length of piling. Last week we observed some ground level settlement in Memorial Gardens which required some investigation. No further settlement has occurred and mitigation measures are in place. Piling will recommence on 25 October. It is anticipated that piling will last another two to three weeks.

During the week commencing 23 October, work will begin in backfilling the area between the sheet piles and the existing wall.

Memorial Gardens

It is now anticipated that scaffolding is expected to be installed in Memorial Gardens on 26 October. Please note that a small number of parking spaces along Arun Street will be temporarily unavailable during the delivery and setup of the scaffolding. This arrangement has been approved in coordination with the West Sussex County Council.

Memorial Gardens is now closed whilst we carry out the works along the wall. The gardens are expected to be closed until April 2024.

Arun River

The jack-up barge is currently in its fifth position along the pile line. It is anticipated that the barge will be moved to the sixth position during the week commencing 30 October.

River Road and Tarrant Wharf
