An apology and update from the Editorial Committee

We are very sorry if you have not received your copy of the Autumn Bell. From your emails, we know how disappointed many of you felt when your Bell did not arrive.

Something went wrong in the process this time, and we have yet to identify the cause. We delivered the normal number of magazines to the distributor. The firm routinely uses GPS trackers, which record that the sub-distributors have gone down the designated streets, but of course, the GPS trackers do not tell us what was posted through any particular letterboxes. We always find a small number of hard-to-find addresses are missed, but we have not previously had any delivery failure on this scale with this distributor.

So what are we doing?

We have placed the limited stock of Bells that we still have in the Post Office. We are also re-printing a quantity of Bell magazines, which are due to arrive in Arundel on September 30th and will be distributed in the first week of October.
